COVID Procedures

For students attending in Person:

Morning Procedures

- It is expected that parents will monitor their children on a daily basis prior to sending them to school. If they have a temperature over 100.4, a cough, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, or have been in contact with anyone who has COVID 19, they are to stay home and contact their physician.
- Students will have their temperature taken daily, prior to entering class.
- Staff and students will sanitize their hands upon entry to the classroom

Masks and Face Shields

- The district/campus will provide one Lytle Pirate face mask and/or face mask to each student.
- School staff and students will wear face coverings upon arrival to the campus and while entering and while moving around room. Face coverings may be removed while staff/ students are seated in a cubicle 6 feet apart.
- Desks and work areas will be sanitized daily.

Meals

- Students will wash and/or sanitize their hands prior to eating.
- Student's meals will be delivered to DAEP. Students will eat at their desks.
- Students will sanitize their hands after finishing their meal.

Restroom Use

- Students will continue to use the restroom one at a time and must wash their hands before exiting the restroom.
- Upon returning to the classroom, students must sanitize their hands.

For students learning remotely:

Attendance

- Active interaction with the Plato system will be tracked. Students will be expected to complete 240 minutes of active interaction to be considered present for the day.
- Parents will continue to submit doctor notes for illnesses.

Technology

- Technology devices will be provided.
- Families who use a school device will be expected to sign an agreement and understand they are responsible for damages.

Remote Learning Expectations

- Students working remotely are expected to complete a minimum of 4 assignments/activities per day, in addition to the active interaction requirements, daily.
- Students that meet **both** the required active interaction time and the required minimum assignments will be credited with one successful day.

Mental Health

- Students will continue to participate in training programs targeting behavior management strategies, social skills, and problem-solving skills addressing diversity, anger management, and conflict resolution.
- Students that opt for remote learning must meet remotely with the DAEP counselor to receive the mental health support.
